This competition is a sanctioned Gold C competition members of Equine Canada 2685 Queensview, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2B 8K2 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Equine Canada Statement of Principle

The Stanhope Equestrian Challenge and Oak Charity Classic are sanctioned Gold C level competition member of Equine Canada and is governed by the rules of Equine Canada.

EQUINE CANADA (EC), The National Federation of Canada, supports humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed under their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.



- Requiring owners, trainers & exhibitors to know & follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition
- Reviewing, revising & developing competition rules & regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed & experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibiting procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor humane.

EC rules address the following general areas:

- Welfare of the horse
- Safety of horse and human athlete
- Administration of competitions (see also Competitions Administration Policy)
- Code of conduct for officials and competitors
- Drug and medication control
- Individual breed and discipline rules

Any owner/rider who competes in a division in which he/she is not eligible to compete will be liable to disciplinary action by the EC. EC current competitive membership is required for all owners, lessees, riders, drivers, agents and trainers competing in EC recognized competitions excepting individual associate members competing in their own breed affiliate competitions.

All entries in this show are governed by the general rules appearing in these pages regarding entries, stabling, post entries, qualifying and all applicable 2011 E.C. rules. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Books.

All exhibitor, owners and person responsible must be Equine Canada Gold competitive membership holders. Temporary memberships to E.C. will be available as well as single event upgrades from Bronze or Silver memberships (A211).

Any rule not covered by the Equine Canada rules and regulations will be covered by the competition management.

Directions to competition grounds

Arriving on PEI from the Confederation Bridge

- Drive EAST on PROVINCIAL ROUTE 1 from CONFEDERATION BRIDGE to TRANS CANADA HWY.
- Continue to follow PROVINCIAL ROUTE 1 E/ TRANS CANADA HWY E for apx. 40 km toward Charlottetown.
- Take the Charlottetown Bypass.
- Continue 5km apx. on the bypass. Take the Exit for Route 2 East * Follow Route 2 for apx. 5km.



- Turn Left on to Route 25 (Watch for the Market with the Bright Red Roof)
- Follow Route 25 to Route 6 and continue to Stanhope
- At the T intersection take a left on to Bayshore Road.
- Take your first right - 200meters - onto Stanhope Lane
- Drive 1km to Ekkho Lane on your left.
- This is the private road to the stable and entry for horse trailers and service vehicles.
- The Spectator entrance is the next left after Ekkho Lane.

Competition information

The Management of the show will not be held responsible for injury to horse and or the rider.

Each competitor is required to have liability insurance and provide proof with the entry form.

The entry form must be signed by the person responsible (Art.A1011) for the horse/rider. If the owner is under the age of 18 yrs as of January 1st, 2011 the form must also be signed by a parent or guardian. You will NOT be permitted to show if the entry form is not signed.

All persons mounted on a horse anywhere on the competitions grounds must wear approved protective head gear properly secured and boots with heels. The protective head gear must meet ASTM or BSI standard and display the SEI seal (G102). This rule applies to both senior and junior riders.

Fees and Refunds

Refunds of 100% of the **entry fee and levies** will be refunded if a veterinarian or Doctor's certificate is supplied to the show no later than **July 25, 2010. Equine Medication control fee and Jump Canada Levy will be refunded. Stabling fees and administration fees will not be refunded.**

If you are already entered and wish to enter another division or class there will be a \$5.00 post entry fee over and above the class fee.

Horse Show Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes where they deem it advisable if a minimum of 4 entries for each division is not received by the closing date. (A505)

A photocopy of your membership card as well as your insurance card must be sent with your entry. Please include a photocopy of your Provincial membership with entry if applicable (A203.1).



Passports & Yearly Horse Licenses: They are mandatory for hunters and jumpers. (temporary licenses may be purchased at the show(A411.3). These are to be passed in when picking up ring number. It is the riders responsibility to pick up passport when ring number is returned. Foreign entries must an affidavit of horse eligibility A404.2.

Jump Canada Levy: \$10 per horse or pony entered in an Equine Canada hunter division will be remitted to the JCB in order to support their development programs. **Equine Medication Control:** Fee of \$7.00 per horse or pony competing in EC divisions must accompany entry. A602.5 Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competitions grounds be selected for equine medication control testing. **Pony Measurement:** If you have a pony to measure please contact the steward or let the show office know. A time will be arranged.

NSF Cheques: will be charged \$50.00 to the competitor.

The main barn area is off limits to exhibitors' horses

Championships and Presentations

Entries will return to the ring in appropriate attire with their horse with horse to receive their placing. Championships will be awarded following the completion of the division. All riders and coaches must wear proper attire when entering the show ring. Juniors must have their helmets secured.

The Stanhope Equestrian Challenge and Gingerwood Charity Classic competition management believe in fair play and sportsmanship. If a competitor or their support staff behaviour is deemed inappropriate they will be asked to leave the show grounds and will forfeit entry fees and prize money.

Championships: Champions will be awarded at the end of the each phase.

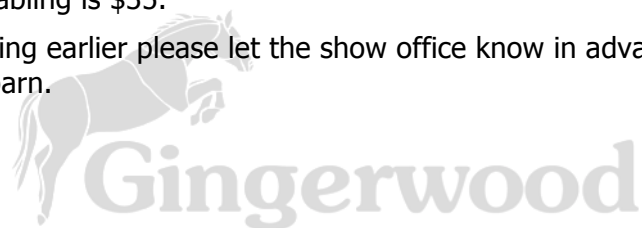
There will be an overall Best Groom and Best Stable display. Nominations for the best groom can be given to the horse show secretary. Judging will take place all week.

Stabling and Shipping in

\$175 is a flat rate for stabling from Sunday July 31- August 7th. The per night cost of stabling is \$35.

The grounds will be open for shipping in **SUNDAY JULY 31, 2011**. If you plan on arriving earlier please let the show office know in advance so special arrangements can be made. A washstall will be provided in an area outside the barn.



Stabling: The first 100 entries that entered for both phases will be entered into a draw for free stabling for the 2012 competition.

Bedding & Hay

- Bagged shavings will be available at a cost of \$7.00 per bag
- Shavings ordered on the entry form will be delivered to your stall prior to your arrival.
- Shavings will be available throughout the competition. Deliveries will be made once a day, in the afternoon. Please place order before 11:00am to receive your shaving same day, otherwise they will be delivered the following day in the afternoon. Shavings can be purchased at the horse show office.

Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse.
